Wooden elephant

You will need:

- Clean cloth
- Jigsaw
- Paintbrush
- Piece of 6mm plywood for elephant ears
- · Piece of 25mm plywood for elephant body (ours measured approximately 300mm x 300mm)
- Pencil
- Resene Aquaclear gloss
- Resene Colorwood testpot of Resene Red Beech
- PVA glue
- Sandpaper



Step one

Draw an elephant shape on the piece of 25mm plywood. If you prefer a template to trace around, these can be downloaded and printed from the internet.



Step two

Draw two elephant ear shapes on the piece of 6mm plywood.



Step three

Carefully cut out these shapes with a jigsaw.



Step four

Sand off any pencil marks and smooth any rough edges with sandpaper. Wipe off any sanding dust with a clean cloth.



Step five

In Australia:

Fix the ears into position with PVA glue and allow to dry.



Carefully apply one coat of Resene Red Beech to the sides of the elephant shape, as shown.



Step seven

Apply one coat of Resene Red Beech to the front and back of the elephant shape and allow two hours to dry.



Step eight

Apply three coats of Resene Aquaclear gloss to the wooden elephant, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.





To get the look:

Mark painted the background wall with Resene SpaceCote Flat tinted to Resene Mint Tulip.



Other ideas:

Wooden toys can also be painted using a selection of Resene testpot colours, but do make sure you prime them first with Resene Quick Dry.
