# Resene

## **Glass candle holder**



**Difficulty level** ★easy ★★moderate ★★★challenging

Resene art with Mark Rayner - 40

#### You will need:

- Candle
- Glass vase
- Glass pebbles
- Small wooden dish
- Paintbrushes (including an artists' brush)
- PVA glue
- Resene Enamacryl Metallic Scotty Silver
- Resene Multishield+ gloss
- Resene Sandtex Mediterranean effect tinted to Resene Heather
- Resene Waterborne Smooth Surface Sealer



Step one

Apply one coat of Resene Waterborne Smooth Surface Sealer to the small wooden dish and allow to dry for two hours.



Step two

Using a light stippling technique, apply one generous coat of Resene Sandtex to the dish and allow to dry for two hours.



Step three

Using a light stippling technique, apply two coats of Resene Scotty Silver to the dish, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



Step four

Apply one coat of Resene Multishield+ gloss to the dish and allow to dry for two hours.



Step five

Apply a generous amount of PVA glue to the base of the glass vase, as shown.



Step six

Place the glass vase in the centre of the painted dish and allow the glue to dry.



Step seven

Place a generous layer of glass pebbles in the base of the vase, as shown.



Step eight

Stand the candle on the layer of pebbles.





### To get the look:

Mark painted the background wall with Resene SpaceCote Flat waterborne enamel tinted to Resene Mariner.



#### Other ideas:

Create a sumptuous gold metallic effect using a base coat of Sandtex tinted to Resene Porsche and two topcoats of Resene Bullion.
