You will need:

- Clean cloth
- Old vase ours was ceramic, glazed on the inside and unglazed (but nonporous) on the outside
- Paintbrush

- Resene Acrylic Undercoat
- Resene Aquaclear gloss
- Resene testpots of Resene Copper Fire and Resene Wild West
- Sandpaper



Step one

Lightly sand the outside of the vase to 'key' the surface.



Step two

Wipe off any sanding residue with a clean cloth.



Step three

Apply one coat of Resene Acrylic Undercoat to the outside of the vase and allow to dry.

Step four

Apply one coat of Resene Wild West to the outside of the vase and allow to dry.





Step five

Apply one coat of Resene Copper Fire to the outside of the vase and allow to dry.



Step six

Apply a second coat of Resene Copper Fire to the outside of the vase and allow to dry.




Step seven

Apply a coat of Resene Aquaclear to the outside of the vase and allow to dry.



Step eight

Apply two further coats of Resene Aquaclear to the outside of the vase, allowing the first coat to dry before applying the second.



Transform a plain

ceramic vase into

To get the look:

Mark painted the background wall with Resene SpaceCote Low Sheen tinted to Resene Half Dutch White.



Other ideas:

For a dazzling purple metallic effect apply two coats of Resene Funtasia over a basecoat of Resene Daisy Bush.
