Shabby chic table

You will need:

- Old wooden table
- Paintbrush
- Resene Crackle Effect
- Resene Gold Effects
- Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene Havoc
- Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene Negroni
- Resene Multishield+ Flat
- Resene Quick Dry Acrylic Primer Undercoat
- Sandpaper



Step one Sand the table to remove any old paint or varnish.



Step two Prime the table with one coat of Resene Quick Dry Acrylic Primer Undercoat. Allow to dry.



Step three Paint the table with one coat of Resene Havoc. Allow to dry.



Step four Apply a generous coat of Resene Crackle Effect to the table. Allow to dry.



Step five Paint the table with one coat of Resene Negroni. Allow to dry – the crackle effect should now be visible



Step six Lightly sand the edges and corners to expose the Resene Havoc underneath.



Step seven Apply another coat of Resene Crackle Effect to the table. Allow to dry.



Step eight Mix one part Multishield+ Flat with one part Resene Gold Effects and apply one light coat to the table. Allow to dry thoroughly before using the table.

Get the distressed look with this elegant shabby chic table.



To get the look:

Mark painted the surrounding wall with Resene SpaceCote Low Sheen tinted to Resene Soft Apple, an authentic traditional colour from the Resene Heritage colour range.



Other ideas:

For a more dramatic effect, omit steps seven and eight the Resene Havoc crackles will really contrast with the Resene Negroni – or try other vibrant colour combinations such as Resene Supernova/Resene Nero, Resene Turbo/Resene Blackcurrant or Resene Sail/ Resene Space Cadet.
