



### You will need:

- Artists' brushes
- Clean cloth
- Old paintbrush
- Resene Waterborne Smooth Surface Sealer
- Resene testpots of Resene Alabaster, Resene All Black, Resene Guardsman Red and Resene Wild Thing
- Sandpaper



#### Step one

Lightly sand the paintbrush handle, as shown. Wipe off any sanding dust with a clean cloth.



#### Step two

Apply one coat of Resene Waterborne Smooth Surface Sealer to the paintbrush handle and allow two hours to dry.



#### Step three

Paint the paintbrush handle with two coats of Resene Wild Thing, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



#### Step four

Paint eyes and mouth with Resene Alabaster, Resene All Black and Resene Guardsman Red, and allow to dry. How cool!

Turn an old paintbrush into a funky puppet toy with a little bit of help from Resene.



#### Top tip:

If you want your brush head to have a particular coloured hair just dip the bristles into a testpot and allow to dry.



#### Here's another idea:

This brush head was painted with Resene Alabaster, Resene Get Reddy, Resene Nero and Resene Sorbus.
