Akoranga Campus on the North Shore Auckland is quite literally the new home of students with the completion of the ambitious 10 block AUT Student Village accommodation complex. With an array of new buildings on the one site, each has been kept in tone with its neighbour by common design style and by repetition of the exterior colour palette across all blocks.

The predominantly neutral exterior scheme of Resene Tea (beige) and Resene White Pointer (blacked white) includes feature panels of Resene Oxley (dusty green), Resene Brandy Punch (burnt orange) and Resene Delta Blue (warm blue) combined with trims and downpipes of Resene Arapawa (deep sea green blue), successfully adding colour without cluttering sightlines. Exterior substrates are finished in a mix of Resene Lumbersider satin acrylic (concrete foundation walls, fibrous cement sheet soffits, timber posts and fascias), Resene Resitex Medium textured finish with a protective glaze of Resene Multishield+ (Harditex walls) and Resene Hi-Glo high gloss acrylic (PVC downpipes and rainwater tanks).




Interior substrates are dominated by Resene Zylone SpaceCote, a low sheen waterborne enamel combining the toughness of an enamel with all the benefits of a waterborne product. Joining this finish is Resene Qristal Poly-Satin polyurethane on timber wall panels and Resene Lustacryl semi-gloss waterborne enamel on timber architraves and joinery. With students coming and going at rapid pace, the interior systems were selected for long-term toughness and resistance to damage and ease of use.

Soft yellows increase the perception of warmth and light in the interior in the form of Resene Splash (light yellow) walls and Resene Scotch Mist (mid yellow) trims mirrored in high traffic areas. A single strong feature wall of Resene Cab Sav (burgundy red), Resene Juniper (blue green) and Resene Salt Box (purpled grey) is allocated to each building in prime communal space. The yellow tones are extended into typical individual apartments and enlivened with features such as Resene Tuscany (terracotta) in each kitchen.

I Block is designated as a service and social area housing essential services such as a laundry, common room, computer, data and electrical rooms for the benefit of all. The colour scheme detours into hues of Resene Acropolis (light beige), Resene Tea (beige) and Resene Napa (grey neutral), highly popular yet functional neutrals, easily accented with accessories to suit changing student tastes.

With clever use of colour and judicious facility provision purpose built for a smart resident set this accommodation scores an A⁺ all round.



Once a BNZ bank branch and today an historically listed building featuring classical architecture, column entrance and impressive double doors, the image of Logan Brown restaurant in Cuba Street, Wellington is cemented in one's mind well before one steps over the threshold.


Selecting a palette of hues sympathetic to the building's status, passers-by are treated to an exterior palette of a **Resene Gravel** (dark grey) base, **Resene Nomad** (soft brown) walls, **Resene Acropolis** (muddy neutral) trims and feature **Resene Red Berry** (bright red) doors. The cementitious exterior was spot primed with **Resene Sureseal** pigmented sealer to bind together areas of exposed porous substrate before topcoating in two coats of **Resene Sonyx 101** semi-gloss acrylic. The wooden door required a full priming coat of **Resene Quick Dry** Acrylic Primer Undercoat and with two topcoats of **Resene Enamacryl**, the job was complete, just in time for the next round of diners to make their grand entrance.



otherwise be designated as rubbish and dumped. Through recycled art classes, children are shown how to recycle waste materials and turn them into works of art. Each month DARZART make a donation to Kidzfirst Hospital to enable them to continue buying art materials for the children in the wards.
