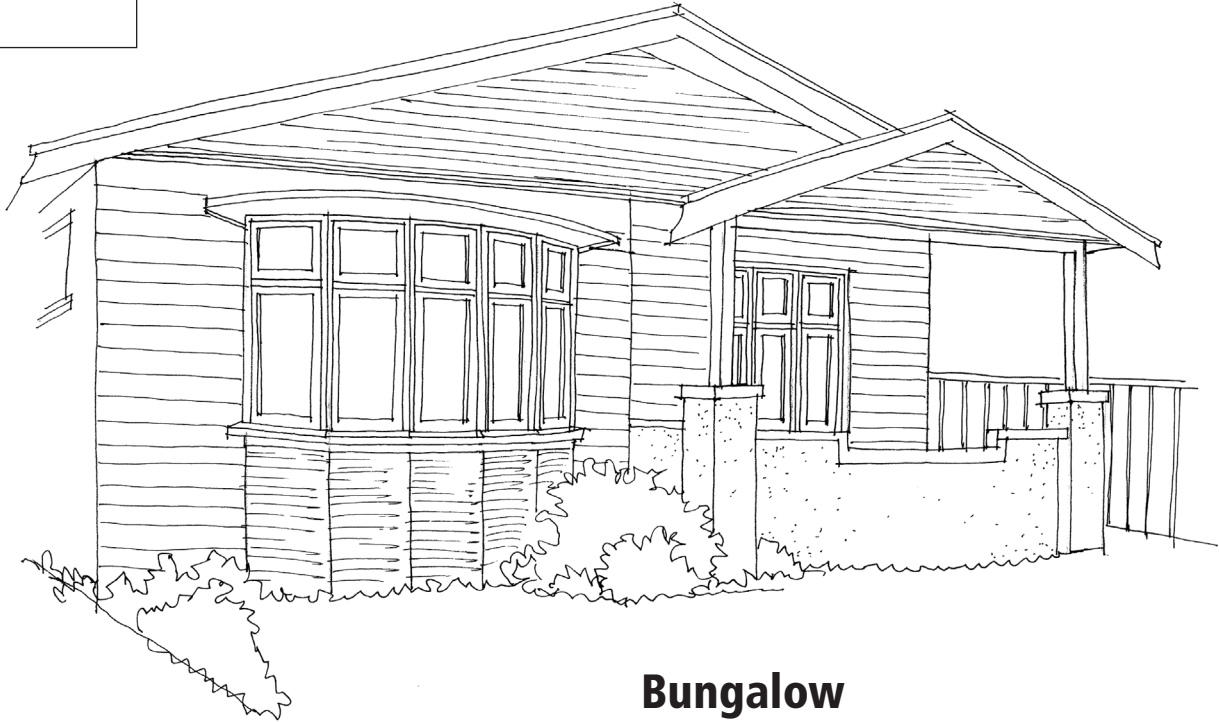


# Create your own colour scheme

## Roof

Often the roof will be a dominant element in your colour scheme. Remember the roof is the most exposed to the elements so choose a durable colour to keep it looking its best for longer. Resene Summit Roof (satin) or Resene Hi-Glo (gloss) is ideal. See the Resene Roof systems colour chart for colour ideas. Consider using a Resene CoolColour to minimise heat buildup.



## Bungalow

### Weatherboards

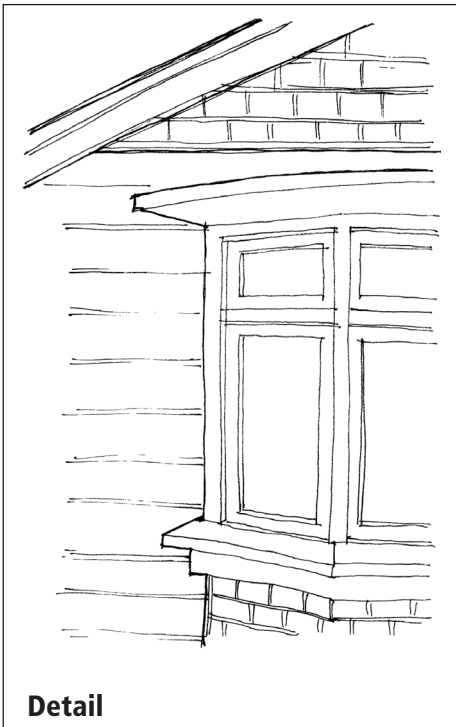
Traditionally weatherboards are painted white, off white or light grey. Wooden shingles on the gable and below bay windows are often painted a darker colour. Use Resene Hi-Glo (gloss), Resene Sonyx 101 (semi-gloss) or Resene Lumbersider (satin).

### Windows and doors

Windows are usually a different colour to the weatherboards, particularly the opening sashes. Choose a contrasting colour and use Resene Enamacryl (gloss waterborne enamel), Resene Lustacryl (semi-gloss waterborne enamel) or Resene SpaceCote Low Sheen (waterborne enamel).

### Trim

Add interest to your colour scheme with a different colour on porch posts and beams, windowsills, fascias and bargeboards.



Detail

Build your scheme by adding swatches of your favourite Resene colours to the boxes.
