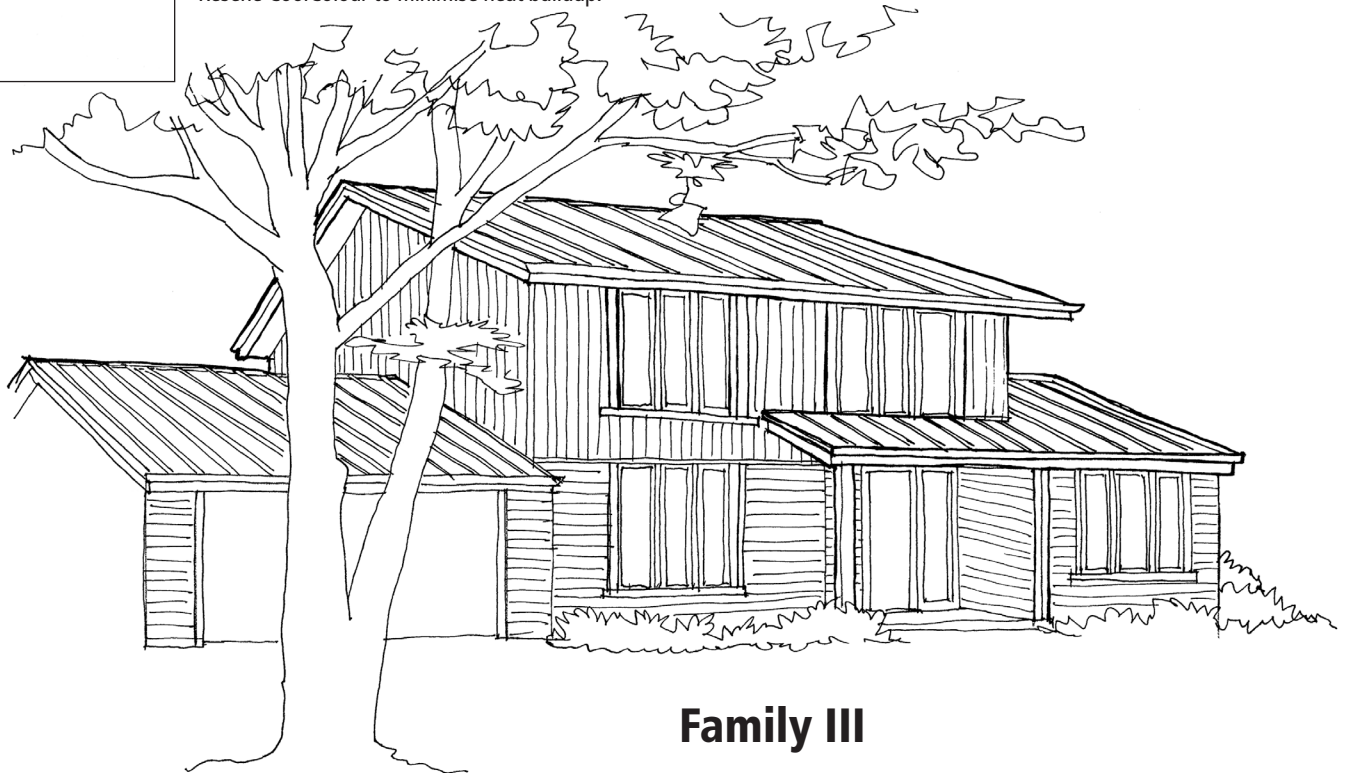
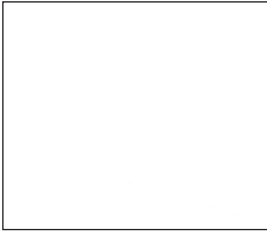


# Create your own colour scheme

## Roof

The roof should be included as part of your colour scheme as it will have a strong impact on the overall appearance of your home. Remember the roof is the most exposed to the elements so choose a durable colour to keep it looking its best for longer. Resene Summit Roof (satin) or Resene Hi-Glo (gloss) is ideal. See the Resene Roof systems colour chart for colour ideas. Consider using a Resene CoolColour to minimise heat buildup.



## Family III

### Weatherboards

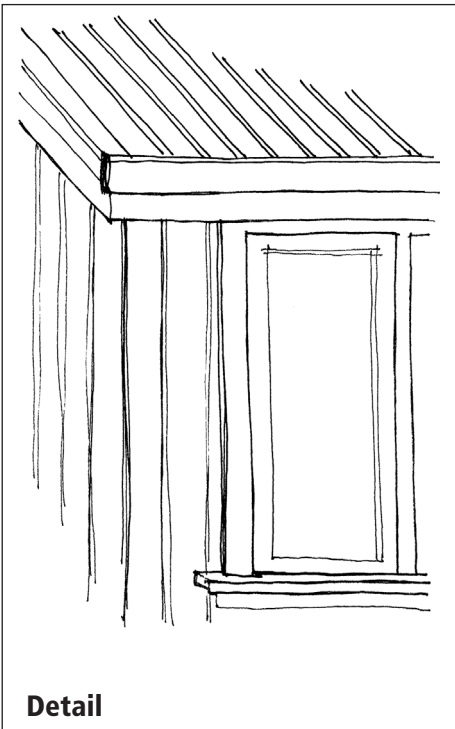
This style of house may look good in various colour schemes. Either choose a dark solid colour for weatherboards with lighter trim and windows or vice versa. Use Resene Hi-Glo (gloss), Resene Sonyx 101 (semi-gloss) or Resene Lumbersider (satin).

### Windows and doors

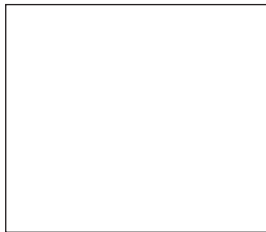
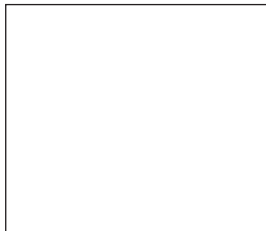
Windows should match or contrast the weatherboards. 'Pick out' opening windows in a different colour. Use Resene Enamacryl (gloss waterborne enamel), Resene Lustacryl (semi-gloss waterborne enamel) or Resene SpaceCote Low Sheen (waterborne enamel).

### Trim

Fascias, bargeboards and windowsills may also be painted to contrast or match weatherboards. Try to keep the scheme relatively simple - don't be tempted to choose too many different colours!



### Detail
