You will need:

- Clean cloth
- Electric screwdriver with drill bit
- Old wooden banister or piece of dowel
- Paintbrush
- Pencil
- Piece of wood or plywood
- Plastic hoops

- PVA glue
- Resene Quick Dry
- Resene testpot of Resene **Get Reddy**
- Ruler
- Sandpaper
- Saw
- Screw



Step one Mark and cut the piece of wood or plywood to make the hoopla base.



Step two Sand any rough edges on the hoopla base and lightly sand the wooden banister or piece of dowel. Wipe off any sanding dust with a clean cloth.



Step three Mark the central point on the hoopla base, as shown.



Step four Drill a pilot hole in the centre of the hoopla base, as shown.





To get the look:

Mark painted the background pegboard with Resene Enamacryl tinted to Resene Aqua.



Other ideas:

For a bright yellow effect, paint the hoopla base and pole with Resene Supernova.

Step five Apply some PVA glue around the hole.



Step six Fix the hoopla pole to the base with a screw. Allow glue to dry.



Step seven Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the hoopla base and pole, allowing two hours to dry.



Step eight Apply two coats of Resene Get Reddy to the hoopla base and pole, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.
