Mark Rayner creates a simple yet effective wall planter.

You will need:

- Stainless steel bucket
- 12mm marine ply2 x stainless steel washing-
- 2 x stainless steet washing line hooks
- 40mm galvanised nails
- Large nail
- Saw
- Hammer
- Screwdriver



- Resene Quick Dry Acrylic Primer Undercoat
- Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene Nero
- Potting mix
- 1 x large Sedum
- `Autumn Joy'



USING a skilsaw or handsaw, cut a panel of ply measuring 550mm x 850mm.



USING a paint roller, apply one coat of Resene Teal Blue to the outside of the container. Allow to dry, then apply two coats of Resene Lucifer.



USING the hammer and large nail, mark the screw holes for the two washingline hooks (300mm from top edge and, centrally, 100mm apart).



APPLY two coats of Resene Nero to the front and sides. Allow to dry, then turn over and paint the reverse.



USING good-quality potting mix, plant the sedum into the stainless steel bucket. Water well and allow to drain, then hang the bucket from the hooks on the ply panel.



ATTACH the ply panel to the fence with 40mm galvanised nails. Touch up the nail heads and any marks with a coat of Resene Nero.

SCREW the washing-line hooks into position.



USING the hammer and large nail, punch a series of drainage holes in the bottom of the stainless steel bucket.
