### You will need:

- Bamboo skewers cut to 40mm lengths (you might need a grown up to do this)
- Paintbrush
- Resene Art Action Quick Dry
- Resene testpots of Resene All Black, Resene Bowie and Resene Root Beer
- Self-hardening modelling clay



#### Step one

Mould the hedgehog body out of modelling clay and insert the bamboo or matchstick 'spines', as shown. Allow to dry overnight.



#### Step two

Apply one coat of Resene Quick Dry to the hedgehog body and 'spines' and allow to dry.



#### Step three

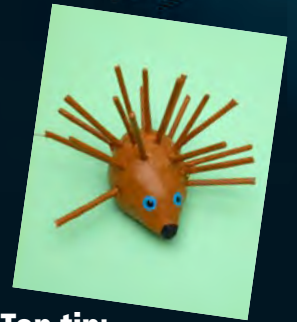
Apply two coats of Resene Root Beer to the hedgehog body and 'spines', allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



#### Step four

Paint in the eyes and nose with Resene All Black and Resene Bowie. How fab is that?

Create this fabulous prickly hedgehog model with a little bit of help from Resene.



#### Top tip:

If you don't have any bamboo skewers use craft matchsticks instead or even twigs from the garden.



#### Here's another idea:

This cool goldfish was made from self-hardening modelling clay and painted with Resene Alabaster, Resene Nero and Resene Sorbus.
