Judges fly in from USA and Italy for Resene Architecture Exposition

Architects and architectural students packed the George Fraser Gallery on the University of Auckland campus in August to witness the opening of the second Resene Paints Architecture Exposition.



The exterior texture and interior carports were finished with Lumbersider Lo Sheen and the exposed cedar doors in aluminium frames and other cedar fitments were all treated with three coats of Resene Forester Alpine Cedar, with bold effect finish and with bright red Hi Glo for the trim. The office was treated with smooth surface sealer and then Hi Glo black.
- 2. The Bay of Plenty Polytech Rex Williams Centre is part of an overall development for the Polytechnic designed by the architects Dennisdon & Hodgson. The Rex Williams Centre, a recreation facility, features a tropical duo theme designed by Dean Turner, the project architect, in which the soft, deep tones of Zylone 20 were balanced against the bold chrome highlighted panels. John Blair was the Contractor.
- 3. North City House has become one of the two or three most controversial and talked-about new office buildings in New Zealand. Project Manager Paul McKay knew that the paint finish would be crucial to the striking concept of this Tauranga commercial building and he chose Zylone 20, complemented with Lumbersider, along with Resene X200 waterproofing system finish for the exterior. Doug McKenzie was the Contractor.
- 4. For many years the dominant supplier to restoration projects and to broadcasting and film company stage and exterior lot sets, it was no surprise that Bill Cunningham and his team provided the paints for Tauranga's Historic Village, which has immediately become one of the nation's top ten tourist attractions. The paints used in this extraordinary working and life-like replica of life in early New Zealand were mainly Hi Glo acrylics specially selected because of their ability to cope with the flexing movement of the wooden structures.
